SEND UPDATE - A message from Ms Weitzman

As a whole school, we have been reflecting on our environment and how it enables the learning of all students including those who learn a little differently. Class teachers have reflected on both the physical environment and the learning culture that is created by our daily practice.

"The physical environment is extremely important as it supports and enhances the quality of the teaching and learning as well as playing an important part in the engagement and self-esteem of pupils of all ages and abilities. It is especially important to pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities that the learning environment is appropriate for their needs."

NASEN – Supporting SEN: The Learning Environment - 2022

Following a school-wide audit, we are making some edits including an increased use of visuals to support the children's understanding and memory and to help them to navigate the busy school timetable on both a daily and longer term basis.

We are also ensuring that appropriate additional support is in place for all students who need it as part of our Ordinarily Available Provision. This starts with a differentiated curriculum offer, but also includes a wide range of strategies such as: vocabulary lists, writing frames and sentence starters, concrete apparatus, now/next boards and timers, task planners, fidget toys and movement breaks.

These resources can be helpful not only for those students with identified SEND:
